The Nutcracker leaps back onto the stage this holiday season

MILWAUKEE – Nov 19, 2021 - Milwaukee Ballet brings its celebrated classic, <u>*The Nutcracker*</u>, back to the stage this holiday season. Widely anticipated year-after-year as the premiere, family-friendly festive production in Milwaukee, *The Nutcracker* will ring in the holiday season December 10 at the Marcus Performing Arts Center and run through December 26, 2021.

Last season Milwaukee Ballet offered an original abbreviated adaptation, *The Nutcracker: Short & Sweet*, to limited audiences in-person in its Baumgartner Center for Dance and a digital presentation On Demand.

"I'm so pleased we're able to provide Milwaukee with their annual holiday tradition once again. I'm proud of the resiliency and creativity we demonstrated being the first local arts organization to return to in-person performances with our adaptation last year. It provided the perfect footing knowing our COVID-19 protocols could successfully keep our audiences and artists safe and healthy, and still provide an inspiring, quality experience at the theater," said Artistic Director Michael Pink.

"Now we can confidently present the full production at Marcus Performing Arts Center, and I invite everyone to join us for this heartfelt story that honors everything we love about this wonderful time of year: family, friends, good cheer, and a little magic," he added.

As a measure to prioritize health and safety, Milwaukee Ballet joined the resident groups of Marcus Performing Arts Center, and organizations and venues around the city, in instituting new Audience Entry Protocols that require patrons ages 12 and older to provide proof of vaccination against COVID-19 or a negative test result taken within 72 hours of the performance start time. All patrons ages 3 and older must be masked in the facility.

"These enhanced protocols have helped everyone feel safe in the theater without diminishing the excitement of live performances," said Pink. "I can still tell how many people are smiling behind their masks, and I've received more notes than ever from grateful patrons telling me how much they enjoyed the shows. The protocols shouldn't dissuade anyone from coming and enjoying a night at the theater."

The Nutcracker is the city's largest annual holiday spectacle, featuring exquisite set pieces, period costumes, special effects, live music, and a cast of nearly 150 dancers, including students from

Milwaukee Ballet School & Academy who will be joining the professional dancers of Milwaukee Ballet on stage for the first time since *The Nutcracker* in 2019.

Milwaukee Ballet Orchestra also returns for their first performance in two years to play Tchaikovsky's signature score under the baton of Associate Conductor Pasquale Laurino.

This year's production will feature new dancers in principal roles for the very first time. "One of the delights of performing *The Nutcracker* every year is you get to watch the dancers grow into new challenges and responsibilities. A few of them will shine in their new roles this year, and the audience will enjoy their take on characters they know and love," said Pink.

Milwaukee Ballet's talented artists perform a variety of different roles in *The Nutcracker*, ensuring the experience feels new every time the audience comes to the theater.

Pink's interpretation of *The Nutcracker* is highly regarded for its lavish production design and intricate storytelling, which includes plenty of action to keep the audience enchanted whether they are seeing it for the first or fiftieth time.
