





# How to Stream MILWAUKEE BALLET ON DEMAND Performances on Your Television

## Stream video from your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch

1. Connect your device to the same Wi-Fi network as your Apple TV or AirPlay 2-compatible smart TV.
2. Find the video that you want to stream.
3. Tap . In some third-party apps, you might need to tap a different icon first.\* In the Photos app, tap , then tap .
4. Choose your Apple TV or AirPlay 2-compatible smart TV. Need help?

\*Some video apps might not support AirPlay. If you can't use AirPlay with a video app, check the App Store for tvOS to see if that app is available on Apple TV.

## Stream video from your Mac

1. Connect your Mac to the same Wi-Fi network as your Apple TV or AirPlay 2-compatible smart TV.
2. On your Mac, open the app or website that you want to stream video from.
3. In the video playback controls, click .
4. Select your Apple TV or smart TV.

## Screen Mirror/Stream from Windows Device

How you enable screen mirroring is dependent on the version of Windows running on your device.

### Windows 8.1

### Windows 10

1. Open the action center on your Windows device. Refer to this [Microsoft article](#) if you need help locating the action center.
2. Select **Connect**.
  - **Note:** You may need to expand the action center to see the **Connect** option.
3. After a moment, you will see a list of wireless display and audio devices.
4. Select your Roku device and follow the on-screen instructions.

# Use ChromeCast to View Chrome Browser on TV

To show Chrome on your TV, you'll need:

- A Chromecast, Chromecast Ultra, or TV with Chromecast built-in.
- A computer and Wi-Fi network with the [minimum system requirements](#).
- A recent version of [Google Chrome](#) (version 72 or higher).
  - [Update your Google Chrome browser if needed](#).
- To connect your computer and Chromecast device to the same Wi-Fi network. Learn how to [check the Wi-Fi network of your Chromecast device](#).

Cast a tab from Chrome

1. On your computer, open Chrome.
2. At the top right, click More  > Cast.
3. Choose the Chromecast device where you want to watch the content.
  - If you're already using the Chromecast, your content will replace what's on your TV.
4. When you're done, to the right of the address bar, click Cast  > Stop casting.

## Connect with an HDMI cable

**1. Pick up a spare HDMI cable** from a [dollar store](#) — they're not expensive — order one online or borrow one from a family member if you don't already have a second HDMI cable.

**2. Plug one end** of the HDMI cable into your laptop's HDMI output jack.

**3. Plug the other end** of the cable into your television's HDMI port. You may need to move your computer closer to the TV, and it's a good idea to have your PC or Mac plugged into the wall for power.

Use your TV remote to change the **Source** or **Input** to the one designated for your computer, such as HDMI 2. You should see what's on your laptop screen.
